

# CHECKLIST OF SAFE SCHOOLS, NURSERIES AND KINDERGARTENS

## SCRUBBERS

Mechanical washing (with the help of machines) of floors and surfaces can considerably reduce cleaning time.



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## MANUAL WASHING

If manual washing of the floor is chosen, proceed with the appropriate tools, making movements to "S", for very narrow regular bands, to superimpose the steps, backing towards the door.

## USE OF CLOTH

Do not spray the disinfection product directly on the surface do it on the cloth. Cloths should be replaced frequently..



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## COLOUR CODE

The use of separate cleaning equipment with a "colour code" (depending on the type of cleaning carried out) helps greatly to reduce the risk of cross-contamination.

## USE OF GLOVES

Always use gloves in chemical handling and cleaning operations, with frequent replacement.



## 6 WHAT TO DO FIRST AND THEN

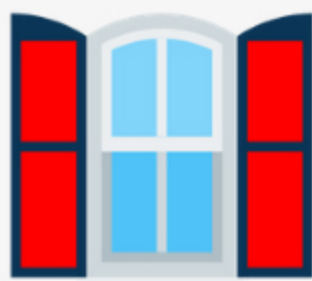
In the cleaning of a room, move from the cleanest to the most polluted areas, also proceed from the top down to prevent the relapse of microorganisms on previously cleaned areas.

## OPEN THE WINDOWS

During cleaning operations it is highly recommended to air the premises.

## DOORS AND RUGS

Perform daily operations of aspiration or brushing of mats and handrails.



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## AT THE END OF THE DAY

Clean all work equipment.

Before handling any chemicals, carefully read the label and/or data sheet..



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## FABRICS

Curtains and other textile materials must undergo a washing cycle with hot water at 60 degrees and detergent. If not possible, add the washing cycle with sodium hypochlorite or hydrogen peroxide products
